Distance Learning Protocol - Spring, 2020

On March 13, 2020, under a statewide shelter-in-place order from California Governor Gavin Newsom, Orinda Academy transitioned to a full distance learning protocol and remained in the distance learning protocol through the end of the 2019-2020 school year. All classes continued to meet without interruption via videoconference, and all of our students were able to access classes, homework, extra help from teachers, learning support, and assessments to complete all second semester coursework.

Grade Recording for Spring, 2020

Because of the abrupt nature of the transition to distance learning and to account for the variety of learning profiles represented by our student body, the school administration determined that we would put in place a “do no harm” grading policy for students. All students and families were given an option to elect a letter grade or a CR/NC (credit/no credit) grade notation for the second semester. We allowed students to choose a hybrid grading system, as we recognized that in some cases, and in some classes, depending on our students’ learning profiles, students thrived in the distance learning protocol, but in some classes they struggled with the challenge of being separated from regular in-person contact with their teachers.

Distance-to-Hybrid Protocol for 2020-2021

To begin the school year, Contra Costa County remains in a category that does not allow for full in-person school meetings. The master class schedule for the school was implemented for the full school year with embedded flexibility that, when permitted by the state, will allow our classes to move from full distance learning to a hybrid attendance protocol with approximately half of the students on campus. In either scenario, all students have access to technology that allows them to access their classes, the learning management system, and robust supports for learning. Classes earning 5 credits per semester meet synchronously four times per week. One day per week is scheduled for asynchronous work, tutorials with teachers, and assessments. Classes earning 2.5 credits per semester meet once per week synchronously with asynchronous work required on Wednesdays or during other unscheduled time.

Grade Reporting for 2020-2021

Grades will be reported on our standard A-F scale for both semesters of the 2020-2021 school year.
